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<b>Name/ title of practice:</b>	Wikimedia Cyprus: Advancing Knowledge Equity and Digital Literacy through Collaborative Editing
<b>Location:</b>	Nicosia, Cyprus
<b>Size and scale of organization:</b>	Informal volunteer group comprising approximately 10–15 active core members, with broader community engagement reaching hundreds through events and workshops.
<b>Industry/Sector:</b>	Non-formal education; civic engagement; digital rights; open knowledge; cultural heritage; ICT for inclusion.

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## Good Practice/Content

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<b>Key focus/bias observed:</b>	Knowledge equity; gender equality; cultural heritage; minority inclusion; digital literacy; human rights; ethical AI.
<b>Description of the <i>Practice</i>:</b>	Wikimedia Cyprus is a volunteer-driven initiative that promotes free and inclusive knowledge through participation in the global Wikimedia movement. Since its inception in 2018, the group has focused on enhancing the representation of Cyprus's diverse communities, cultural heritage, and gender-balanced content on platforms such as Wikipedia, Wikimedia Commons, and Wikidata. It operates at the intersection of digital literacy, social equity, and collaborative knowledge production, leveraging Wikimedia tools to support human rights, cultural inclusion, and ethical reflection on digital technologies.
<b>Implementation strategy:</b>	<p>The practice is implemented through a structured annual cycle combining public events, capacity-building workshops, and targeted advocacy campaigns. Specific strategies include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Organizing edit-a-thons (e.g., WikiGap, HERitage) in partnership with embassies, cultural institutions, and civil society organizations.</li> <li>• Hosting thematic workshops at regional and international Wikimedia events (e.g., Wikimedia CEE Meetings).</li> <li>• Fostering cross-community engagement by encouraging editing in Greek, Turkish, English, and minority languages.</li> <li>• Promoting gender equity by addressing underrepresentation of women and minority voices in online knowledge spaces.</li> <li>• Integrating human rights and AI ethics in educational activities and awareness campaigns.</li> <li>• Collaborating with schools, universities, and NGOs to sustain participation and amplify reach.</li> </ul>
<b>Key actors involved:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Founding and core members of Wikimedia Cyprus (volunteers)</li> <li>• Embassies and cultural institutes (e.g., Embassy of Sweden, Goethe-Institut)</li> <li>• Educational and gender equality organizations (e.g., Girls in STEAM Academy, MIGS)</li> <li>• Public authorities (e.g., Commissioner for Gender Equality, President of the Parliament)</li> <li>• Wikimedia Foundation and Wikimedia regional affiliates (e.g., User Group Greece)</li> </ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Youth, educators, civil society actors, and digital rights advocates in Cyprus.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Outcomes and metrics of impact:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Increased representation:</b> Substantial growth in Cyprus-related content across Wikimedia platforms.</li> <li>• <b>Gender-focused engagement:</b> Annual WikiGap and HERitage events drawing high-level institutional support and addressing the gender content gap.</li> <li>• <b>Cross-border visibility:</b> Recognition through participation and facilitation in regional Wikimedia events (e.g., Istanbul, Tbilisi, Lviv, Belgrade).</li> <li>• <b>Capacity-building:</b> Over 15 workshops held since 2018, reaching hundreds of participants including educators, youth, and cultural professionals.</li> <li>• <b>Policy awareness:</b> Active public discussions on digital rights, ethical AI, and knowledge access at the Cyprus Forum and similar events.</li> <li>• <b>Community resilience:</b> Continued operation despite the challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic, through adaptive online engagement.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Potential challenges and barriers for implementation:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lack of legal registration has historically limited access to funding and formal collaborations.</li> <li>• Volunteer-based structure may restrict continuity, scalability, and systematic follow-up.</li> <li>• Political sensitivities in Cyprus require careful navigation when addressing cross-community or conflict-related content.</li> <li>• Digital divide and low awareness of Wikimedia platforms among certain groups.</li> <li>• Limited local media coverage or mainstream institutional support beyond niche events</li> </ul>
<p><b>Blueprint for success - recommendations for replication or adaptation of the Practice:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Begin with small-scale, thematically focused edit-a-thons to build trust and relevance (e.g., on cultural heritage or women’s biographies).</li> <li>• Identify and nurture local Wikimedia “champions” or multipliers with strong facilitation skills.</li> <li>• Partner with embassies, universities, or NGOs to provide legitimacy, access to venues, and participant pools.</li> <li>• Leverage international observances (e.g., Women’s Day, Human Rights Day) to align events with global narratives.</li> <li>• Ensure content diversity by encouraging multilingual contributions and cross-cultural co-editing.</li> <li>• Combine online and physical sessions to ensure accessibility and inclusivity.</li> </ul>



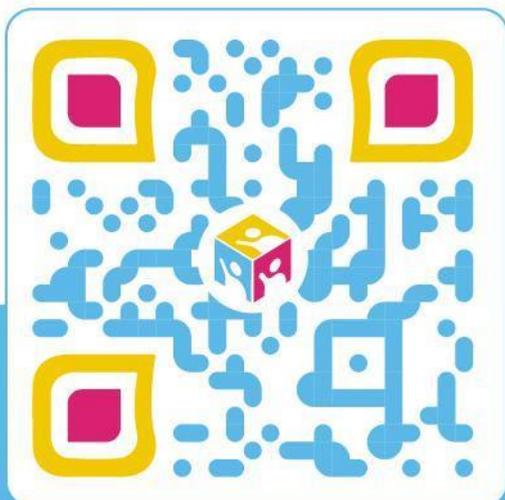
<b>Key lessons learned:</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Institutional support (even symbolic, such as addresses by officials) greatly increases visibility and credibility.</li><li>• Wikimedia is a powerful but underused tool for civic education, particularly in multilingual or post-conflict contexts like Cyprus.</li><li>• Events that mix skill-building with meaningful social themes (e.g., heritage, gender, inclusion) are more impactful and retain engagement.</li><li>• Sustained partnerships with Wikimedia affiliates and regional user groups are key to maintaining quality, mentorship, and visibility.</li><li>• Flexibility and responsiveness to local developments (e.g., COVID-19, political climate) are essential for sustaining operations long-term.</li></ul>
